

# 4D3N Kansai & Kanto (G575)

(Kansai Airport-Osaka-Kyoto-Fuji-Yamanashi-Tokyo-Narita Airport)

## Day 1

Arrive at Kansai Airport

- **Osaka Castle**- The construction of Osaka Castle started in 1583 on the former site of the Ishiyama Honganji Temple, which had been destroyed by Oda Nobunaga thirteen years earlier. Toyotomi Hideyoshi intended the castle to become the center of a new, unified Japan under Toyotomi rule. It was the largest castle at the time.



- **Kiyomizu Temple**-Kiyomizudera is one of the most celebrated temples of Japan. It was founded in 780 on the site of the Otowa Waterfall in the wooded hills east of Kyoto, and derives its name from the fall's pure waters.
- **Kinkaku-Ji** -Kinkakuji is a Zen temple in northern Kyoto whose top two floors are completely covered in gold leaf.
- **Nabana No Sato**-It is a theme park on the island of Nagashima in Kuwana. The main focus is flowers, but it also has an onsen, a number of restaurants, some traditional shops, and most notably one of Japan's finest winter illuminations.

## Day 2

- **Shinkansen Ride**- Experience a 10 minutes bullet train ride from Toyohashi Station to Hamamatsu Station.
- **Fuji 5<sup>th</sup> Station**- It lies at approximately the halfway point of the Yoshida Trail, which leads from Fujiyoshida Sengen Shrine at the mountain's base to the summit of Mount Fuji.



## Day 3

- **Oshino Hakkei**- It is a touristy set of eight ponds in Oshino, a small village in the Fuji Five Lake region.
- **Sensoji (Asakusa Kannon Temple)**-A Buddhist temple located in Asakusa. It is one of Tokyo's most colorful and popular temples.
- **Odaiba Seaside Park**- A popular shopping and entertainment district on a man-made Island in Tokyo Bay. It originated as a set of small man-made fort islands, which were built towards the end of the Edo Period (1603-1868) to protect Tokyo against possible attacks from the sea.
